

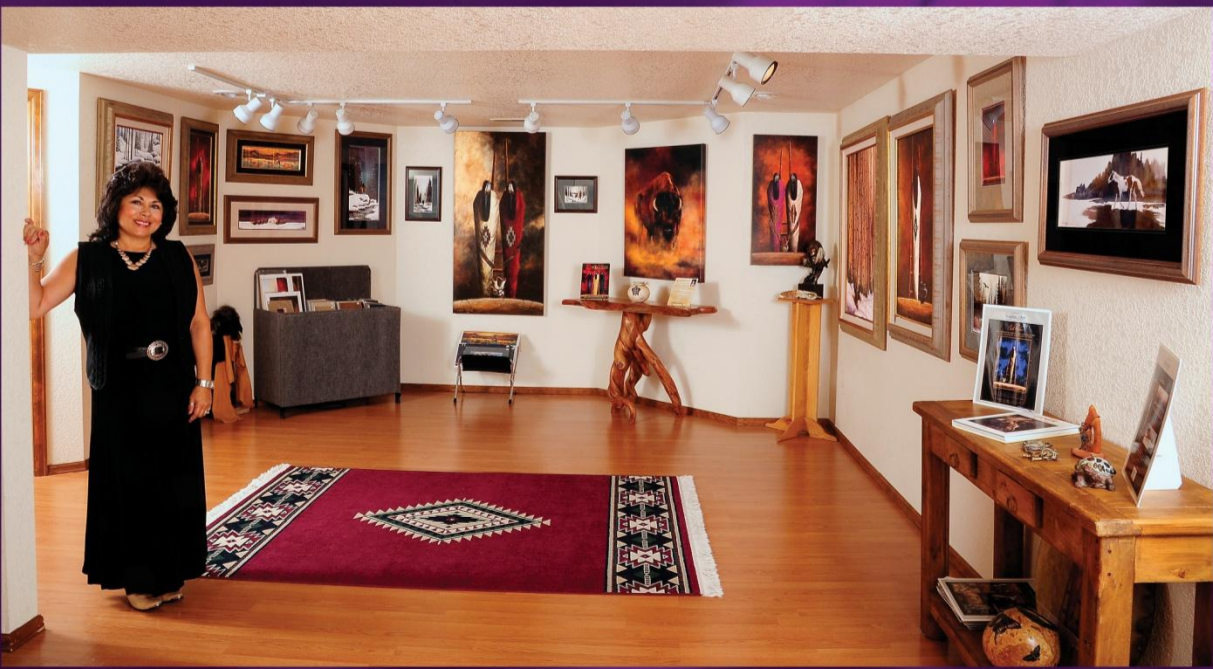
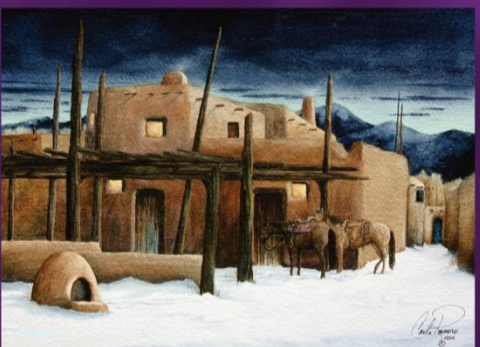
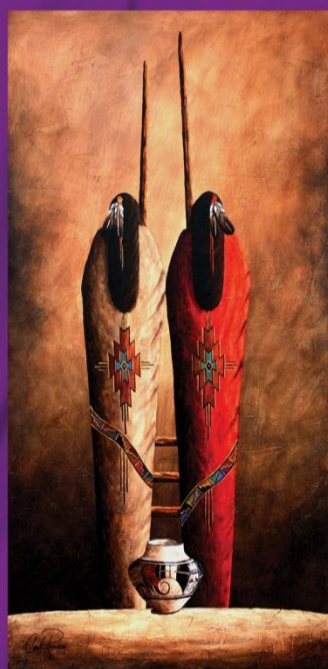
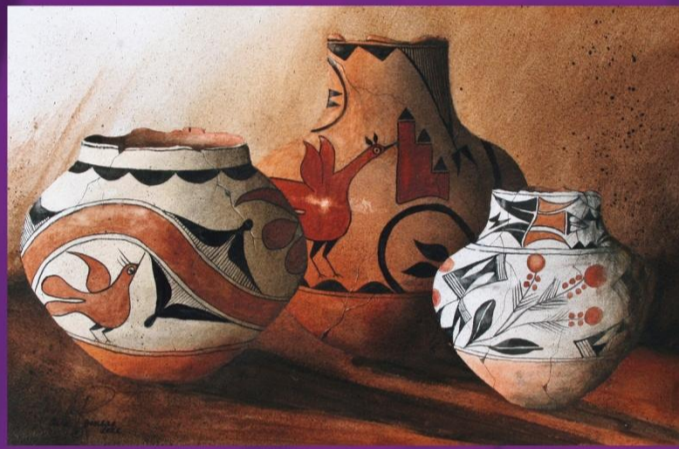
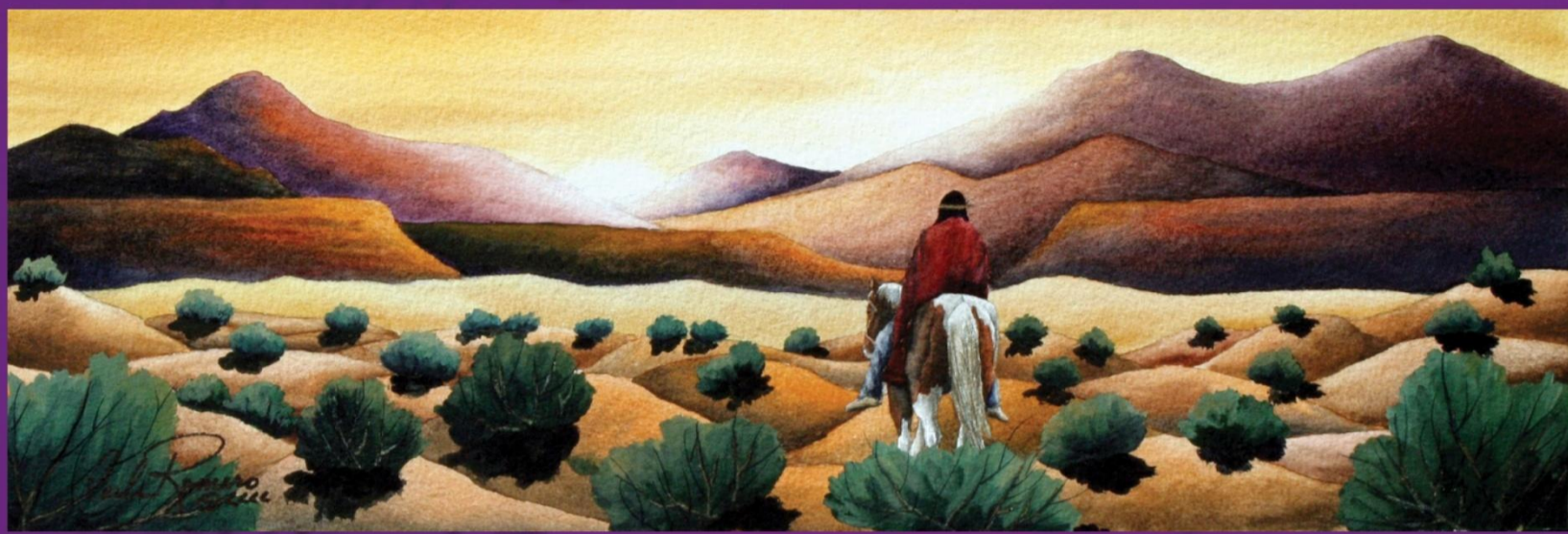
Carla Romero
